The following are important steps to help you through the enrollment process. We look forward to your joining us on campus and becoming a UNO Maverick!

Schedule Placement Exams

Shortly following admission, Freshmen and Transfer students receive information from the Testing Center about English, math, chemistry, French and Spanish placement tests. Math placement is determined by your ACT math subscore or results on the Math Placement Exam (MPE). Students with transfer credit may have already satisfied their testing requirements and should check with an advisor in their UNO college concerning the need to take an exam. Submit your Health Form and Immunization Records

New incoming students must provide official documentation of immunizations and complete a Pre-Enrollment Health Requirement form *BEFORE* they will be able to register for an Orientation session or meet with an academic advisor to register for classes. NU ID and Password

Your NU ID and password established during the application process enable you to access various online services across campus and to log in to **mavlink**: mavlink.unomaha.edu

Using your NU ID and Password, log in to **mavlink** and review your "To Do List" for any outstanding items that may be required prior to enrollment. You will also use **mavlink** to register for orientation and classes; check financial aid awarded; view grades and current class schedules; pay tuition and much more!

Request Your Final Transcripts

If you are currently enrolled at a high school or college, or just graduated from high school, please request a final transcript be sent to the following address after you have finished your final courses.

Dual Enrollment

If you took dual enrollment courses during high school, you must have the official college transcript sent to the address above in order to obtain college credit. Failure to do so will impact your academic advising and delay registration for future courses at UNO.

Consider the Honors Program

If you have a minimum ACT composite score of 26 or SAT 1190 (Critical Reading & Math), consider applying for the UNO Honors Program which is a unique program of study for high achieving students. Change in Admission Term

Your offer of admission is valid only for the term for which you applied. If you plan to enroll for a different term, you must submit a new UNO Application for Undergraduate Admission. If you applied for fall and would like to start this summer instead, please contact the Admissions Office at 402-554-2393 or email unoadmissions@unomaha.edu.

Apply for Financial Aid

If you have not already filed the FAFSA form (Free Application for Federal Student Aid), please visit: www.fafsa.gov to complete the application. The priority deadline was March 1 for consideration for all sources of funds. However, some types of federal aid remains available during the academic year for those who apply after March 1. Students who have already completed the FAFSA will typically be contacted by the UNO Financial Aid Office **via email** within 2-3 weeks of receipt of the FAFSA information. Check your email account frequently for ongoing important messages regarding your financial aid status.

All students enrolled in classes at UNO have a **gmav** email account. New Freshmen and Transfer students will receive and activate their **gmav** accounts at Orientation. Important academic and business information—including your Student Accounts tuition billing statement—are emailed to students.
